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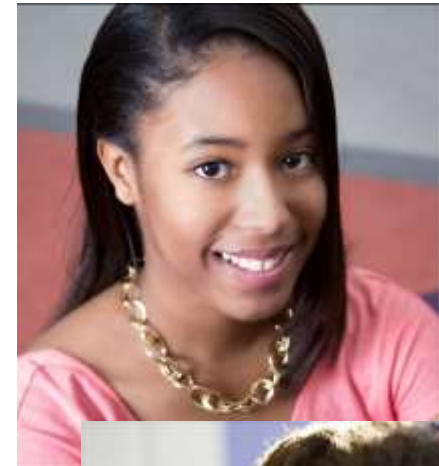
What is ONE Access?

- ONE Access is a collaboration between Charlotte Mecklenburg Library and Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools beginning fall 2015
- CMS students can now use their Student ID number to access and check out CML resources.
- Their CMS Student ID number is their library account number. The PIN is the last 4 digits of the Student ID.



What can students borrow?

- ONE Access allows students to borrow e-resources and access library databases just like any other CML library card.
- Students can also borrow up to 10 print or audio books (no DVDs or music CDs).
- There are no overdue fines for ONE Access accounts, but users are responsible for fees on lost books.



Teacher Loan Card

- Library Card with Unique Privileges for Teachers and Educators
- Features Include:
 - Extended Loan Period (6 weeks with no renewal required)
 - Borrow up to 30 items at a time
- Expires yearly – must present eligibility for renewal each year

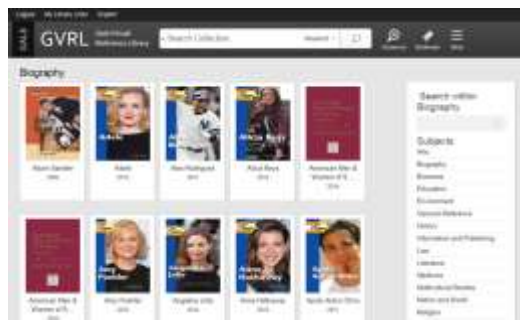
